# A WORD FROM OUR PRINCIPAL...

Tēnā koutou,

# **WHENUAPAI SPORT IN 2021**

# M3 MINDFULNESS

On Tuesday 24th November we welcomed Jase Te Patu to our school. Jase is the founder of the M3 Maori Mindfulness programme. He facilitated some interactive workshops with our tamariki from Year 0 to Year 8. The 3 M's in M3 represent:

- MĀORI STORIES Taha Whānau
- **MOVEMENT Taha Tinana**
- MINDFULNESS Taha Hinengaro/Taha Wairua

It was wonderful to see all our students participate actively within the sessions and engage within the storytelling, movement and mindfulness moments.

Jase also facilitated some PD for our teachers, focusing specifically on Hauora, a Māori philosophy of health which covers the physical, mental, social and spiritual needs. Māori believe that each of these 4 concepts supports the others. He walked us through the process and supported us to add personal and practical strategies to our kete.


