At the end of this term, we will bid farewell to two outstanding staff members, Nathan Atherton and Brooke Bennett. Both Nathan and Brooke began their teaching journeys with us and have consistently delivered exceptional work over the years. Nathan will be heading to England to spend time with his extended family, while Brooke has decided to pursue teaching and travel opportunities abroad.

We are fortunate to announce that Yasmin Mohamed will be stepping into Brooke's role in Waru (WSC Room 8). Yasmin has been a valuable member of the Whenuapai team, serving in various capacities over the past 18 months. Additionally, we welcome Joe Soares as the new teacher for Room 11.

In August, Natasha Howard will return from maternity leave to start our next New Entrant class. Our school's growth continues, with our roll at 625 tamariki at the start of term 3. We anticipate reaching a roll of 650 by the end of the year.

If your child will be joining us this year, please ensure you have completed an online enrolment form. Your input helps in our planning efforts to accommodate all students and maintain appropriate teacher-student ratios and open classroom spaces.

Thank you to everyone who completed our Health and PE Survey during Term 1 (we had a 40% return rate). There was a wide range of diverse responses. The School Leadership Team and Board have reviewed the data and identified the following next steps/recommendations for us to work on. Over the coming terms, we will start unpacking these items and looking at how we can implement these steps. If you wish to read the full report a copy is available at the office.

General Recommendations:

• Improved Communication: Across all year groups, there is a desire for clearer communication about curriculum content. The school should develop strategies to improve communication with whānau about what is being taught and how they can support learning at home.

Years 1-4:

- Physical Education: Offer a variety of regular physical activities that promote and provide exposure to different skills and sports.
- Social Development: Integrate programmes that address expectations in social interactions, diversity appreciation, and growth mindset.

Years 5-6:

- Revisit the curriculum to investigate ways to make sure:
 - There is an emphasis on healthy lifestyle choices, screen time balance, internet/cyber safety, body changes during puberty, personal safety, abuse prevention, anger management, conflict resolution, peer pressure and healthy relationships.

Years 7-8:

- Sexuality Education: Ensure the curriculum provides comprehensive coverage of puberty, including physical changes, social and emotional changes, personal hygiene, developing positive body image, and consent.
- Mental Health: Implement strategies to support resilience, anger management, and mindfulness.
- Friendship Building: Develop initiatives to facilitate friendships among students.

Additional Considerations

- Life Education: Consider incorporating life education discussions that go beyond an instructional approach.
- Water Safety: Integrate water safety skills into the curriculum.

It is timely that the common recommendation was to improve communication. We recognise the importance of communication, which is why it is a key focus outlined in our 2024 annual plan.

During Term 3, we aim to gather your valuable feedback on how we can improve communication within our school community. Over the past two years, we have utilised a range of communication channels including newsletters, HERO posts, videos, face-to-face meetings, community gatherings, and emails.

We have received feedback indicating that our communication is too much, not enough, too early, lacking sufficient warning and our communication is just right. Everyone is different. Our aim through this consultation phase is to learn about the communication styles that meet the community's needs so that we can adjust for 2025. As always, our wish is to work together to meet the needs of your tamariki during their learning journey.

Finally, congratulations to our Year 5 and 6 Football teams who competed in the recent Northwest tournament. Both teams had a fabulous day and a special congratulations to our boys team for winning the event. Also, our Senior Kapa Haka group performed at Auckland Hospital and were outstanding. They upheld all our school values and their performance raised the roof. They originally asked to perform 4 pieces but this was extended to 9 because of their enthusiasm, passion and excellent performance. Mahi tika ana (great work)!

Whenuapai School is an EnviroSchool and we ask that students come to school with waste free lunches (**Nood Food**) to show Kaitiakitanga/Respect to our school environment.

Additions to Massey High School Uniform from 2025

We have some exciting news for members of our wider community concerning our uniform, with some new choices being added. This has been driven largely by our student leaders, and the voice of our wider community.

As you are aware our blazer, shirt, and tie are integral components of our uniform and are a source of pride for our students – nothing changes in this regard. However, for students starting at Massey High School in 2025, there will be additional uniform choices available for all students from the start of the year.

Our existing uniform can be found on our website at Uniform Information.

The options below are being added to our uniform from the start of 2025.

Shorts - Charcoal shorts, with tone-on-tone Massey High School logo. Shorts may be worn with sandals (see below) or with black leather shoes and black socks.


- Sandals are being introduced as a uniform option from the start of 2025. Sandals must be black leather Roman sandals. Further information about other acceptable options will be on our website. No socks are to be worn with sandals, and sandals are not to be worn with long trousers. Please note – crocs and other forms of informal footwear will not be permitted.
- Students taking technology which require enclosed shoes in workshops should bring appropriate shoes for those subjects on the days they are timetabled. Similarly, experiments in science labs will require appropriate shoes. More information will be on our website.

Trousers, shorts, skirts, sandals, shoes will all be uniform choices that can be worn year-round. There is no summer/winter split.

In addition, we will have a new option for our current vest (design being confirmed) and the le faitaga will also become a uniform choice.


