PB4L Corner

This fortnight, we're focusing on Mana (Respect for Self), especially Integrity. We are using language such as "Mana," "resilience," "honesty," and "managing yourself." Try integrating these words at home to reinforce the values we're teaching at school and promote consistency.

Integrity is about doing the right thing, even when no one is watching. It's about being honest, taking responsibility for your actions, and being accountable for your mistakes. When we act with integrity, we build trust and respect with others. We also feel good about ourselves and our accomplishments.


Here are some ways you can help your child develop integrity:

- **Model honest behaviour** Children learn by watching their parents and caregivers. Show them how to be honest, even when it's difficult.
- Encourage your child to admit their mistakes It's important for children to learn that it's okay to make mistakes. Help them understand that the important thing is to take responsibility for their actions and try to do better next time.
- **Be patient and supportive** Developing integrity takes time. Be patient with your child and offer them support and encouragement along the way.
- **Provide opportunities for your child to practice integrity** Look for opportunities for your child to demonstrate honesty and responsibility. For example, you could ask them to help you with a task or run an errand for you.

By focusing on integrity, we're helping our tamariki to develop strong character, build trust, and create positive relationships.
