Kia ora whānau,

As we continue our look towards 2025, we are excited to share our four key annual goals for the year. These goals have been developed as a subset of our broader strategic plan, ensuring we align with both the current needs of our kura and the wider direction of education. Our goals remain deeply rooted in our core values: Kaitiakitanga (Environment), Ako (Learning), Kotahitanga (Others), and Mana (Self).

- **Kaitiakitanga:** We will continue to nurture a safe and supportive learning environment for our whānau (family), ourselves, our whenua (land), and te taiao (world).
- **Ako:** We will grow our responsive teaching practices and strengthen educational pathways, empowering all students to succeed.
- **Kotahitanga:** We are committed to fostering a culture where tamariki (children) and our wider school community feel heard, valued, and connected.
- Mana: We will continue to prioritise lifelong learning, ensuring everyone in our community is supported to grow and thrive.

While we are still in the early stages of developing our detailed annual plan, we are already identifying several key areas of focus for the coming year:

- Safe Classroom Spaces: Ensuring both physical and emotional safety for our students and staff.
- **New Government Initiatives:** Implementing new guidelines for Mathematics, Literacy, Attendance, Assessment, and Reporting.
- Community Engagement: Strengthening relationships with our community, including Friends of Whenuapai (FOW), celebrating learning, and ensuring transparency.
- Unity Across Campuses: Promoting consistency and unity as we grow.
- The Whenuapai Way: Maintaining our unique school culture as we expand our community and staff.
- Staff Development: Continuing to invest in the growth and development of our teaching team.

We look forward to sharing more information early in the new year. In the meantime, if you have any questions, suggestions, or ideas, please feel free to approach a member of the 2025 Senior Leadership Team or our Team Leaders (as listed in previous newsletters).

We are in the final stages of making one more teacher appointment and will share the full school organisation for 2025 once this is complete. We are hopeful that we will have the successful candidate in place within the next two weeks, in time for our Week 8 newsletter. Thank you for your patience and continued support.

Throughout this year, we have kept you updated on the new Government initiatives, particularly in the areas of Structured Literacy and Mathematics. We are pleased to inform you that the Ministry of Education has now released the updated curriculum for Mathematics and English. After reviewing the documents, we are happy to report that the new curriculum levels and learning expectations align with our initial predictions.

**Key Update:** Over the course of this year, we have worked diligently to accelerate our students' learning in preparation for these changes, ensuring they meet the new curriculum levels and expectations. By starting this process early, we have allowed two years to fully transition rather than trying to implement all the changes in just one year (2025). We are thrilled with the progress we've made, and we congratulate our students, staff, and whānau for their hard work and dedication.

The progress reports you've received for your child in 2024 have been based on the new curriculum levels and expectations for 2025.

In other news, work on the development of our home campus property is starting to ramp up. Work is currently scheduled for the Christmas holidays. Unfortunately, this means the school grounds will need to be closed during the holiday period. We will confirm what is happening and the exact dates once the programme of works has been completed.





Argyle's Retail Shop is located at Unit 4 / 91 Central Park Drive in Henderson.




