PB4L Corner

This fortnight's focus is about Kotahitanga - Working together as a team in our class and listening and respecting everyone's Voice.

Working together and respecting each other's ideas makes the classroom a supportive place where everyone feels included and learns better.



Here are some ways you can model and discuss kotahitanga at home:

- Encourage Teamwork: Have your child work on tasks with siblings or other family members, such as setting the table, cleaning up, or working on a project together.
- Practice Listening: Encourage your child to listen when others speak and show respect for their opinions. You could take turns sharing your thoughts and make sure everyone gets a chance to talk
- Celebrate Different Ideas: Help your child understand that it's okay to have different opinions and that everyone's ideas are valuable.
- Model Respect: Show respect when communicating with others, especially when discussing different views, to set a positive example for your child.
- Discuss Problem-Solving: When challenges arise at home, talk about how working together and respecting everyone's thoughts can help solve problems.
- **Praise Cooperation**: When your child works well with others, praise their efforts to encourage teamwork and listening.




























Waste Free Lunchboxes



Whenuapai School is an EnviroSchool and we ask that students come to school with waste free lunches (**Nood Food**) to show Kaitiakitanga/Respect to our school environment.



A waste free lunch means only packing items that can be composted or recycled. That means, no plastic wrap, no foil, no zip lock bags and no packaged foods. We have compost bins for food scraps which we feed to our worm farm which then fertilises our vegetable māra/gardens and fruit trees. Through this process we are teaching the students to be responsible for the waste they create and how they can make a difference to our planet. If students bring waste to school, we ask them to please take this home. Thank you for supporting our school value of Kaitiakitanga/Respect for the Environment.




